OTHER DOCUMENTS

- Supplemental documents must be submitted to the committee members, the committee's director, the NCAA enforcement staff, the institution and all involved individuals **at least 10 days prior to the hearing.**
- Any party that intends to submit additional documents should contact the Director of the Committees on Infractions at the NCAA office.
- In order to properly prepare for the hearing, the committee intends to adhere to the 10-day deadline for receipt of written materials. Absent a showing of good cause, submissions past the 10-day deadline will normally not be accepted by the committee. Any issues relating to the Case Summary or Institutional Response should be raised at the hearing
- In rare cases, (such as the discovery of relevant new information) the committee may permit additional documents to be submitted after that date or at the hearing, provided there are enough copies (at least 12) for the committee and all parties. The decision regarding the acceptance of new information will rest with the committee chair.
- The committee may request additional evidence during the hearing or the committee's deliberations, with copies provided to all parties.

NOTE: The Committee on Infractions has not listened to any tapes or reviewed any memoranda or transcripts of interviews, other than those that are included in the responses listed above. Any party who believes specific portions of an interview are significant should provide the relevant sections to the committee and all other parties prior to the hearing.
