## ISSUE 1

In one of the more high-profile statewide ballot initiatives in the country, Ohio voters **voted down** State Issue 1 by a 54-46% margin. Issue 1 would have enacted a constitutional amendment to create a new Citizens Redistricting Commission comprised of five Democrats, five Republicans, and five independent members to draw Ohio's legislative districts.

## FEDERAL

---

### **PRESIDENTIAL RACE:**

Former President Donald J. Trump and Senator JD Vance defeated Vice President Kamala Harris and Minnesota Governor Tim Walz, receiving 312 electoral votes and winning the popular vote. Swearing-in for President-elect Trump and Vice President-elect Vance will occur on January 20, 2025.

### **U.S. HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES:**

The Republican Party will retain control of the U.S. House of Representatives, though several races are still pending official results. The Ohio Congressional delegation will see a new House member. David Taylor (R-OH) will replace retiring U.S. House Representative Brad Wenstrup (R-OH-2).

### **U.S. SENATE:**

The Republican Party will assume the majority of the U.S. Senate, after gaining three seats in West Virginia, Ohio and Montana. The Pennsylvania Senate race is headed to a recount, although Dave McCormick (R-PA) is leading Senator Bob Casey (D-PA). The Ohio Congressional delegation will have a new U.S. Senator. Bernie Moreno (R-OH) defeated incumbent U.S. Senator Sherrod Brown with 50.2% of the vote. The delegation will also see an additional new Senator once Vice President-elect JD Vance formally resigns his Senate seat to assume the office of the Vice President. Governor DeWine will appoint a new Senator to fill the vacancy until a special election in November 2026.

## STATE SUPREME COURT

---

Ohio voters also decided on three of the seven justices to serve on the Ohio Supreme Court. The outcomes will shift the court's Republican majority to 6-1.

**STATE SUPREME COURT CHIEF JUSTICE** - Democrat Justice Melody Stewart lost to Justice Joe Deters, a Republican, to serve as Chief Justice of the Ohio Supreme Court.

**STATE SUPREME COURT JUSTICE** - Democrat Incumbent Justice Michael Donnelly lost to his Republican challenger, Megan Shanahan.

**STATE SUPREME COURT JUSTICE** - Democrat Lisa Forbes lost to Franklin County Republican Dan Hawkins.

## OHIO SENATE

---

Of Ohio's 33 Ohio Senate districts, there were 17 seats up for election this year, consisting of the 16 even-numbered districts and an election to fill the vacancy of a term for the 33rd Senate District in Youngstown. State Senate terms are four years and in the current 135th General Assembly, the Republicans hold a 26-7 majority. Senate Democrats picked up two seats, which will narrow the Senate Republican's majority to 24-9 in the 136th General Assembly.

**SENATE DISTRICT 16** - In the only Senate seat in Franklin County that was up this cycle, where current State Rep. Beth Liston (D-Dublin) defeated Besa Sharrah (R) to replace outgoing State Senator Stephanie Kunze (R-Hilliard) who was term-limited.

**OTHER KEY SENATE RACES:** Outside of Franklin County, there were two races that were competitive:

**SENATE DISTRICT 6** - State Rep. Willis Blackshear (D-Dayton) defeated Charlotte McGuire (R), a member of the Ohio State Board of Education in this newly drawn district in Montgomery County.

**SENATE DISTRICT 24** - Long-time State Rep. Tom Patton (R-Strongsville) defeated Sue Durichko (D) in this highly competitive Cuyahoga County seat.

## OHIO HOUSE

---

With all House seats being on two-year terms, all 99 districts in the Ohio House were up for election. House Republicans currently hold a 67-32 majority however, due to a loss of two seats, Republicans are expected to have a 65-34 majority heading into next year. Due to a handful of newly drawn legislative districts and term limits, there will be a total of 27 new House members in the 136th General Assembly.

The Franklin County delegation is comprised of Districts 1-12, eleven of which will now be controlled by Democrats.

- District 1 – Incumbent State Rep. Dontavius Jarrells (D – Columbus) ran unopposed and was reelected to another term.
- District 2 – Incumbent State Rep. Latyna M. Humphrey (D – Columbus) defeated Eric Terford (L).
- District 3 – Incumbent State Rep. Ismail Mohamed (D – Columbus) ran unopposed and was reelected to another term.
- District 4 – Incumbent State Rep. Beryl Brown Piccolantonio (D – Gahanna) defeated Jason Allevalo (R).
- District 5 – Meredith Lawson-Rowe (D) ran unopposed and was elected to serve her first term in the House.
- District 6 – Christine Cockley (D) defeated Hussein Jabiri (R).
- District 7 – Incumbent State Rep. Allison Russo (D – Upper Arlington) defeated Susan Miller (WI).
- District 8 – Incumbent State Rep. Anita Somani (D – Dublin) defeated Aaron Neumann (R).
- District 9 – Incumbent State Rep. Munira Abdullahi (D – Columbus) defeated Brandy Seymour (L).
- District 10 – Mark Sigrist (D) defeated Brian Garvine (R).
- District 11 – Crystal Lett (D) defeated Stephanie Kunze (R – Dublin).
- District 12 – Incumbent State Rep. Brian Stewart (R – Ashville) defeated Brad Cotton (D).

**Other Key House Races:** Outside of Franklin County, there were some closely contested races in a handful of swing districts:

- District 23 – In Lake County, Democrat State Rep Dan Troy (D – Willowick) fended off a challenge by Tony Hocevar (R) in this increasingly Republican NE Ohio county.
- District 27 – Cincinnati-area Democrat incumbent State Rep. Rachel Baker (D – Cincinnati) defeated Curt Hartman (R).
- District 31 – Republican incumbent Bill Roemer (R – Richfield) held off his challenger A.J. Harris (D) in this Summit County District.
- District 35 – Incumbent State Rep. Steve Demetriou (R – Bainbridge Twp.) fended off a challenge by Mark Curtis (D).
- District 52 – Incumbent State Rep. Gayle Manning (R – North Ridgeville) won her race against Genevieve Flieger (D) in this Lorain County district.

(as adopted 9/29/2023)



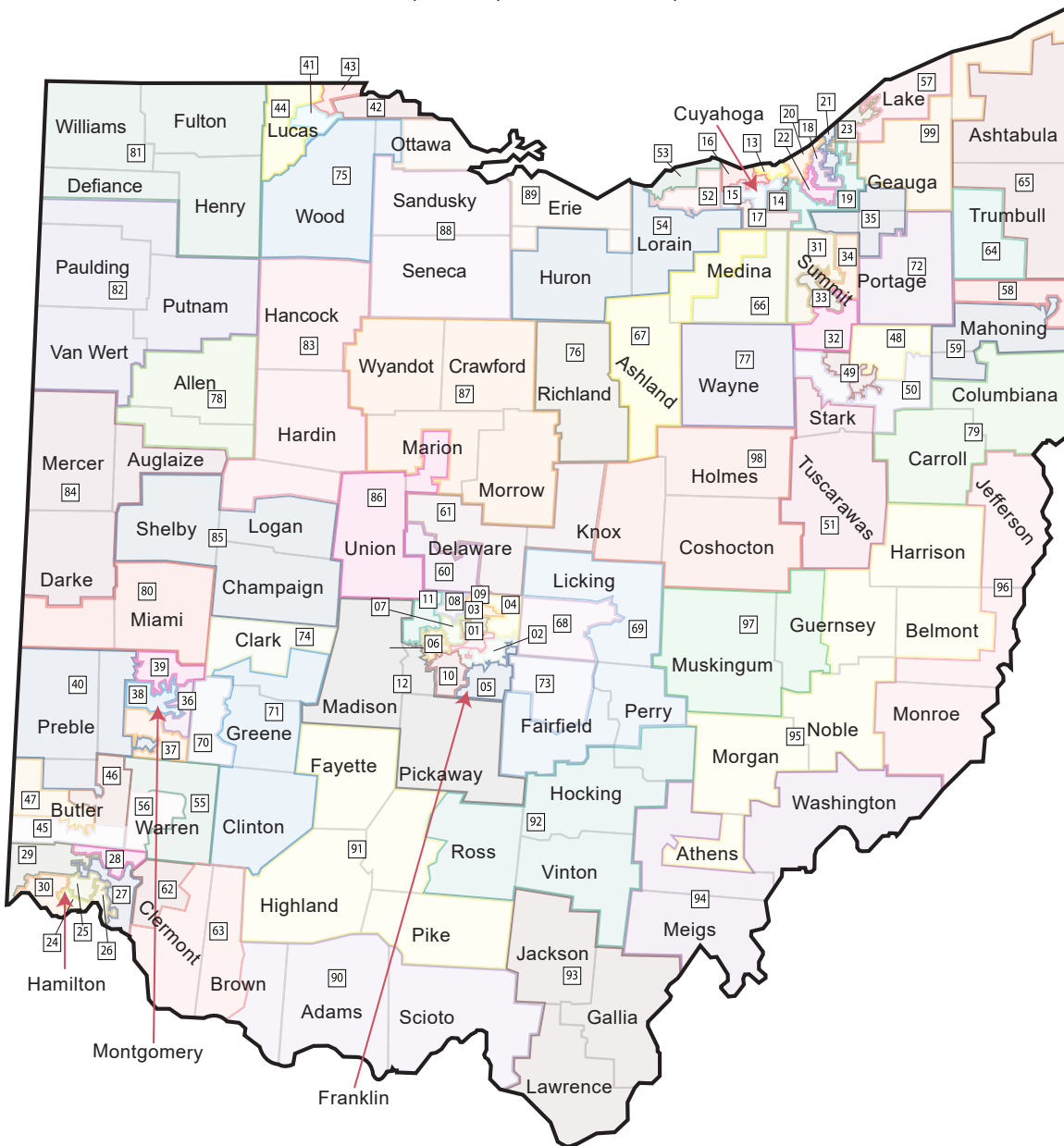
